A phoneme of a language or dialect is an abstraction of a speech sound or of a group of different sounds which are all perceived to have the same function by speakers of that particular language or dialect. For example, the English word through consists of three phonemes: the initial "th" sound, the "r" sound, and a vowel sound.

Phonology as grammar of phonetic patterns The consonant cluster /str/ is OK at the beginning, middle or end of words in English. At beginnings of words, /str/ is OK in English, but /tr/ or / tr / are not (they are ungrammatical). / tr/ is OK in the middle of words, however, e.g. in "ashtray".

Some syllables consist of just one vowel sound (V) as in *in* and *eye* / aɪ /, *owe* /əʊ/. In English, a syllable can consist of a vowel preceded by one consonant (CV) as in *pie* / paɪ /, or by two consonants (CCV) as in *try* / traɪ /, or by three consonants (CCCV) as in *spry* / sprɑɪ /.
