Some syllables consist of just one vowel sound (V) as in I and eye / ai /, owe /ə/. In English, a syllable can consist of a vowel preceded by one consonants (CCV) as in pie / pai /, or by two consonants (CCV) as in try / trai /, or by three consonants (CCCV) as in spry / sprai /.
