The data are generally nonnumerical. Qualitative methods include ethnography, grounded theory, discourse analysis, and ...

Qualitative Research and its Uses in Health Care

In qualitative studies, the issue of generalization is even more complicated, and more controversial. Qualitative researchers seldom worry explicitly about the issue of generalizability. The goal of most qualitative studies is to provide a rich, contextualized understanding of human experience through the intensive study of particular cases.

Generalization in quantitative and qualitative research ...

Evaluation interviews examine new programs or school developments and suggests improvements. Since evaluation deals with incorrect behaviors as well as positive ones, justifications [accounts] of behaviors result. The result may consist of myths and unresolved tensions (Patton, 1990).
